

## ICAI future work plan: July 2017 – June 2018

This work plan sets out the areas of UK aid spending which ICAI plans to scrutinise over the coming year.

The review topics are based around five strategic themes which help ensure our work covers the most important challenges facing UK aid, and that we build up a body of evidence over the lifetime of the Commission. Our work plan includes looking at UK aid spend across all of government, not just DFID.

Over the next year we plan to conduct a series of reviews on procurement – an important topic to government and to taxpayers. The first in the series has already begun work and will focus on **DFID's management of its supplier market**.

In addition to the work plan below, ICAI is due to publish a number of reviews before July 2017. These focus on:

- Migration in the central Mediterranean
- Inclusive growth in Africa
- Reducing conflict and fragility in Somalia
- Follow-up review (an annual review)
